Appropriate analytical techniques to extract meaningful insights from data, including RCA, systems thinking, and benchmarking against internal and external standards.

Right Action

Translating insights into concrete, measurable interventions that address underlying causes of incidents. Includes closed-loop feedback systems, clear accountability frameworks, and ongoing evaluation of improvement initiatives.

These four pillars work in synergy to create a comprehensive approach to patient safety incident reporting. When all components function effectively, healthcare organizations can move beyond simply collecting incident data to active learning and sustainable safety improvement.

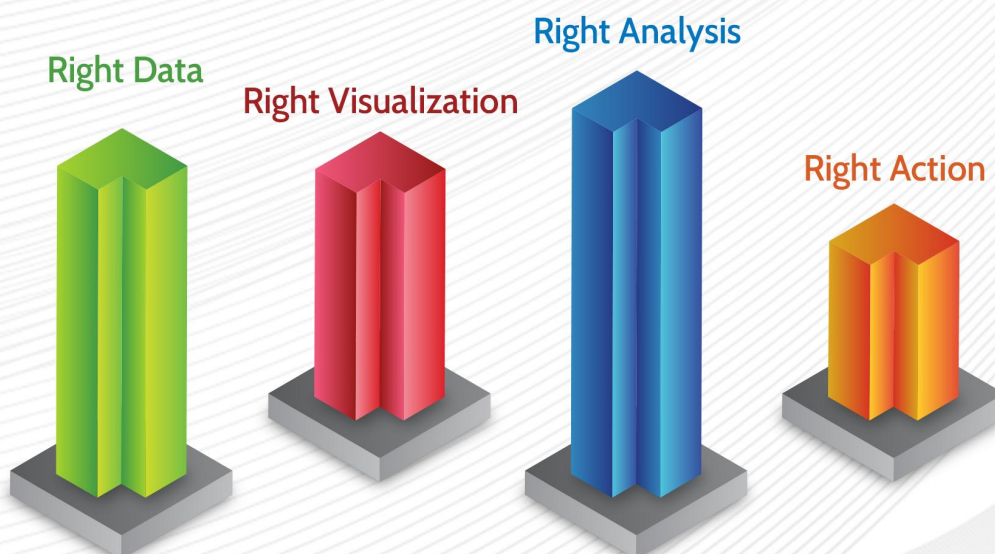
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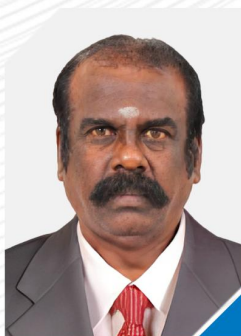
